Myopia in Children: What You Need to Know.

- Myopia is a progressive eye disorder that often begins to develop between the ages of 7 and 13, when children are experiencing a fast rate of growth. It can be caused when the eyeball grows too quickly or continues to grow after ages 10–12, when eye growth should normally stop.
- When left untreated, Myopia can lead to struggles in school and activities for your child due to poor vision, as well as increased eye disease risks.
- Because myopia progression is faster at age 7, there is a greater overall effect in slowing it down by 50% with the myopia control treatment.
- Myopia control has both the short-term benefits of better vision between eye exams and long-term benefits of protecting eye health.
- Myopia control treatments options can include soft contact lenses, ortho-k contact lenses and atropine eye drops. and soon special types of spectacle lenses (glasses).
